SYMPOSIUM: THE RIGHT TO MIGRATE IN THE EUROPEAN HUMAN RIGHTS SYSTEM	
RESUMO DO SIMPÓSIO / SYMPOSIUM SUMMARY	
<p>Considering the need to discuss the human right to migrate in the face of the emergence of the new European Pact on Migration and the Global Pact for Migration, the Symposium: The Right to Migrate in the European Human Rights System is proposed. Firstly, it is important to study the regulation of the human right to migrate by the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union and the European Convention on Human Rights. Secondly, the study and analysis of the European Pact on Migration and the Global Pact for Migration are salutary, mainly with regard to the principle of non-refoulement and to the possibility of making indirect devolution feasible.</p> <p>In this sense, the discussion about the jurisdiction of States is also relevant, both in the territorial sense and with regard to the accountability of States in relation to extraterritorial human rights violations. Thus, the following questions are expected regarding the jurisdiction and the right to migrate: concept, meanings, the “cause and effect” jurisdiction model (Case A.S and others v. Italy - UN Human Rights Committee); the analysis of the case against Malta (CCPR / C? 128 / D / 3043/2017); the accountability of States for pushback operations and the way in which these operations violate the European legal regime for the protection of the human right to migrate; migration in the jurisprudence of the European Court of Human Rights - cases (merely exemplary): M.N. and others v. Belgium; Georgia v. Russia (II), SS and others v. Italy and Hiris Jamaa et al. v. Italy. It is expected, with the Symposium, to reach a level of academic reflection that presents a scientific contribution to society regarding the human right to migrate in the European System.</p>
